In addition we need to be able to add day care for those families who have children in our preschool. God has an answer for us. Help us pray not to miss it.

June 16th will be a night of gospel music featuring our praise team as well as the praise team from Immanuel Chapel from South Coffeyville. Bob Bush will also join us again for the night of gospel music. This concert will be right here in our facility. Admission is free with donations being accepted for Relay for Life.
