**A Note From Our Pastor**

I am writing this article much later this week than I usually write. It has been a very busy week.

Monday I spent the day riding the bus in and out of the flood area as a chaplain to the flood victims who were seeing the area and in some cases their own homes for the first time. The bus made a route through the area but did not stop to let anyone off. I had seen flooding before, but mostly out in the country side. I had never seen anything like what we experienced Monday.

Thursday I was ask to go into a home with a young person whose home had been flooded. All this person was able to salvage of their life before the flood was a piece of jewelry, a few dishes, a shovel, rake and hoe. The water had been up to the eves of the house and nearly to the ceiling inside. Pictures on the wall, furniture, clothing, all were destroyed by the flood. Mold was growing and presented a real health hazard.

I have also attended many meetings this week. Ministers have been meeting to make sure that we all have the same information as to where help is needed and to try to eliminate duplication. City meetings have been held as well and as pastors we were encouraged to be present as chaplains and hopefully as a calming influence.

Our community and some of our own people here at Grace, have seen things that I hope they never will have to see again and have lost mush if not all their property. I do continue to pray however, that they will see the hand of God moving to restore them as they look to the future. God's love has not ceased. He is still reaching out.

I hope you will be able to gather with us this coming Sunday as we worship the King of Kings and Lord of Lords. Come ready to praise and ready to learn. God will bless us in powerful ways.
